Every year, despite the real challenges of pandemic and inflation, the generosity of individuals, families, and local businesses wows our staff and board. These direct donations, along with such fundraising projects as raffle baskets and book sales, augment SHHFL's annual library tax levy income of \$189,200 (approved by public vote in November 2023 as a municipal ballot proposition)

The operating budget pays for salaries, library collection materials, technology, ongoing programming for children and

seniors, and everyday services and supplies that keep the library running — from electricity to toilet paper. It does not cover remodeling and renovation costs, which are funded by grants and donations earmarked for our Capital Campaign.

One reason our little library is able to meet high standards of service (to which even large libraries aspire) is that our community values and supports our work.
