

#### Dear Neighbors:

On Election Day 2023, registered voters in the Town of Marlborough will have the opportunity to cast their ballots for a proposition increasing the annual contribution of the Town of Marlborough for the operating budget of the Sarah Hull Hallock Free Library by \$36,700. This increase, which is comparable to the purchase of one half-gallon of ice cream per year (or \$5) per family, will bring the library's annual operating budget from \$152,500 to \$189,200. The current \$152,500 budget per year pays for everything - from the fun materials like streaming services and bestsellers, workshops and classes, to the not-so-glamorous electric bills, to the essential expenses of staffing.

The last time the Milton Library increased its budget was five years ago, in 2018. Although direct donations and grants have helped underwrite the recent and very necessary improvements to the historic library building, they cannot sustain the day-to-day expenses of library operations. For this reason, in 2023, the library seeks increased funding – in order to continue to offer dynamic children's programs, update public computer stations, and meet the rising minimum-wage costs of staffing.
